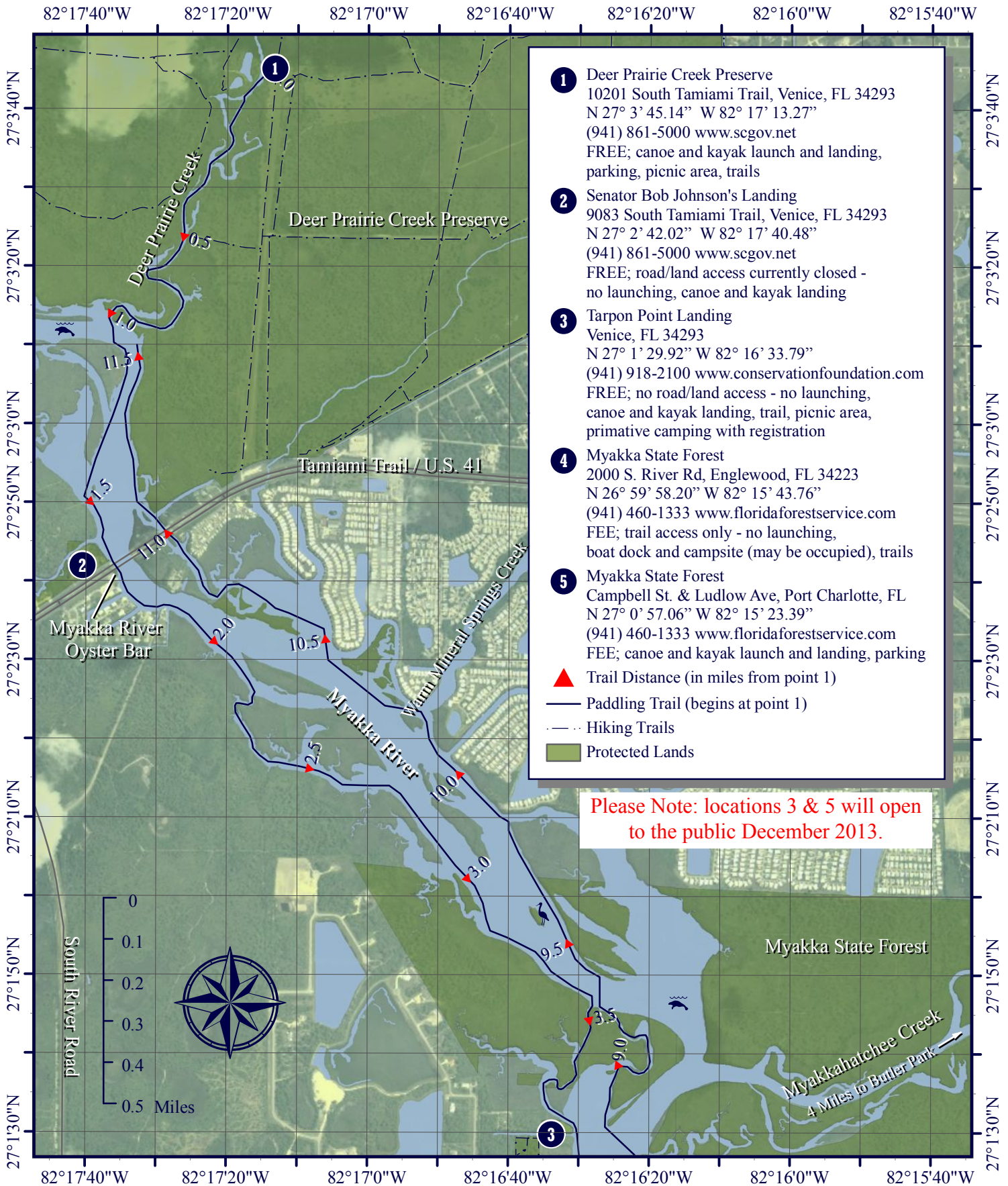


Paddling Map - Lower Myakka River

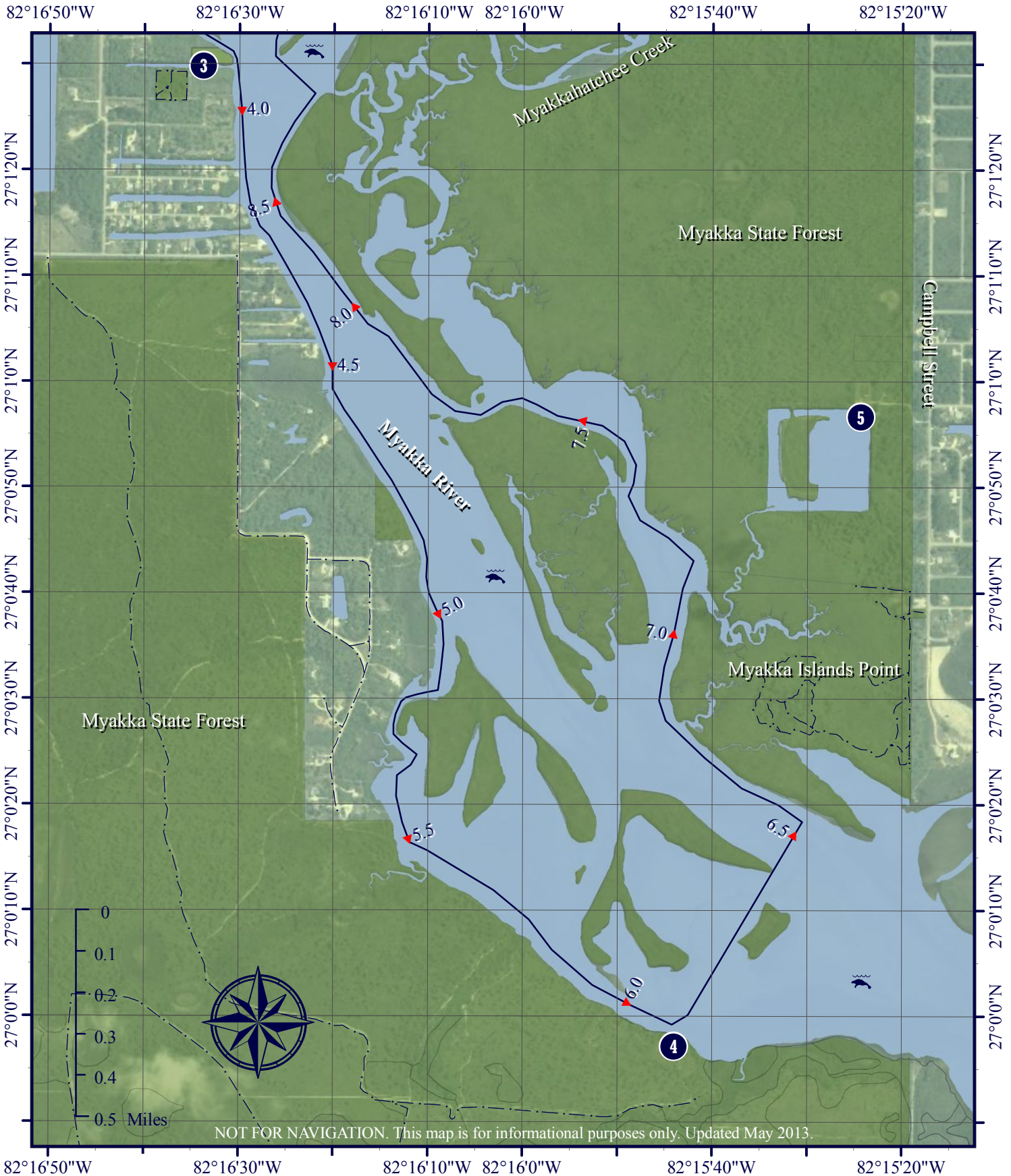
